

AVENUE OF FLAGS

Indiantown Gap National Cemetery began serving the veteran community in 1982. The Indiantown Gap National Cemetery Memorial Council, a not for profit non government agency, has supported the Cemetery throughout the years. This council consists of members of Veteran Service Organizations throughout the Commonwealth. The Council sponsors Memorial Day and Veterans Day activities as well as The Avenue of Flags.

The Avenue of Flags is a presentation of flags beginning at the main entrance and winding its way through the Cemetery. These flags are interment flags, donated to the Cemetery in honor of a deceased veteran for the purpose of flying on flag holidays.

These flags may be the interment flag from any veteran or active duty person, no matter where they are buried. They are presented in loving memory of those who gave their all and are displayed with the same loving care.

Our Avenue of Flags commemorates our fallen; to pay homage to those men and women who served their country. Indiantown Gap National Cemetery assists in the collection of flags to be displayed and the procurement of flagpoles so that this Avenue may extend throughout the entire cemetery.

When a flag is donated, cemetery personnel do not know when your flag will be flown or from which flagpole. Donated flags are used as needed to replace worn flags. Nameplates are not placed on flagpoles.
